

THE LUCILLE LORTEL THEATRE's mission is to foster both new and established artists, increase awareness and appreciation of Off-Broadway, and uphold fair and equitable business and artistic practices in service of creating a larger, more diverse community of theatre makers and audiences. The Company builds on the legacy of its founder, Lucille Lortel (1900–1999) who was a champion of work by Samuel Beckett, Caryl Churchill, Athol Fugard, Jean Genet, Adrienne Kennedy, Larry Kramer, Terrence McNally, Marsha Norman, Sam Shepard, and Wendy Wasserstein. In addition to its Off-Broadway theatre, which has been in continuous operation since 1955, the Company is renovating a three-story carriage house in Chelsea that will act as the Company's new headquarters. Its programs include The Alcove at the Lortel, a commissioning and development program for early and mid-career playwrights; the 121 Project, a bespoke development program for new musicals; NYC Public High School Playwriting Fellowship, Fellowships in NYC Theatre at Bennington College, Dangerous Acts: A Series Uplifting Black Writers from Our Past (in partnership with HBCUs), Lucille Lortel Awards and Playwrights' Sidewalk, Internet Off-Broadway Database (IOBDB.com), and Non-Profit Theatre Strategic and Management Services. RUBEN SANTIAGO-HUDSON

Ruben Santiago-Hudson's multifaceted career spans stage, television, and film. He made his Broadway acting debut as Buddy Bolden in *Jelly's Last Jam* opposite Gregory Hines. His portrayal of Canewell in August Wilson's *Seven Guitars* garnered Ruben a Tony® Award for Outstanding Featured Actor in a Play. Some of his other most cherished stage acting credits include: Broadway: *Lackawanna Blues, Stick Fly, Gem of the Ocean, Jelly's Last Jam*. Off-Broadway: August Wilson's autobiographical play *How I Learned What I Learned, The Winter's Tale, Henry VIII, Measure for Measure* (The NY Shakespeare Festival), *East Texas Hot Links* (Public Theater), and *Ceremonies in Dark Old Men* (The Negro Ensemble Company).

Ruben's expansive directing credits include Manhattan Theatre Club's Tony® Award Winning production of *Jitney*. Other Broadway productions include *Skeleton Crew* (Obie Award, 6 Tony® nominations) and *Lackawanna Blues* (Outer Critics, Drama Desk, NY Drama Critics, Helen Hayes) which marked the first time in Broadway history that an individual wrote, directed, and starred in a play.

Some of Ruben's select directing credits are: *The Piano Lesson, Paradise Blue, Two Trains Running, The Happiest Song Plays Last, Destiny of Desire, Your Blues Ain't Sweet Like Mine, Gem of The Ocean, The First Breeze of Summer, My Children My Africa,* and *Seven Guitars.*

Ruben has starred in many films including *Their Eyes Were Watching God, American Gangster, Lackawanna Blues, Selma, Mr. Brooks, Shaft, The Devil's Advocate* and *Domestic D*isturbance among many others. His television credits include "East New York," "Billions," "The Quad," "Public Morals," "Castle," the PBS Nova special "Forgotten Genius," "The Red Sneakers," "American Tragedy." and "Solomon and Sheba" with Halle Berry and Jimmy Smits, the first biblical movie made starring actors of color.

Ars Nova presents a feverish bounty of programming, spanning from one-night discovery performances to innovative, often genre-bending, world premiere Off-Broadway productions – and supports a dynamic slate of residencies and development programs to foster outside-the-box thinking. Dubbed by *The New York Times* as a "fertile incubator of offbeat theater," Ars Nova is the premier hub for visionary, adventurous emerging artists of all stripes.
