LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD



STEPHEN McKINLEY HENDERSON

Mr. Henderson's seven Broadway shows include two Best Revival Tony® winners, *Fences*, for which he received a Tony nomination and the Richard Seff Award for Outstanding Supporting Actor, and *A Raisin in the Sun*. His most recent Broadway appearances were as Pops in Stephen Adley Guirgis' Pulitzer Prize winning drama, *Between Riverside and Crazy*, and as Torvald in the heralded replacement cast of *A Doll's House Part 2* led by Julie White.

For his work Off-Broadway in Mr. Guirgis' Pulitzer winner, Mr. Henderson received Obie and Lucille Lortel Awards. Other Off-Broadway roles include Pontius Pilate in *The Last Days of Judas Iscariot* and Turnbo in *Jitney* which transferred to the National Theatre of Great Britain earning August Wilson the Olivier Award. In the fall, of 2013 Stephen served as Ruben Santiago Hudson's associate artistic director for audio recordings of Wilson's Century Cycle which were live streamed throughout the cyber world.

Early career roles for various LORT companies include Azdak in *Caucasian Chalk Circle*, Bynum in *Joe Turner's Come and Gone*, Creon in *Antigone*, Falstaff in *Merry Wives of Windsor*, Sizwe in *Sizwe Bansi is Dead*, Sitting Bull in *Indians*, Solyony in *Three Sisters*, and Winston in the Irish premiere of Athol Fugard's, *The Island* for the Dublin Theater Festival.

He is a Fox Foundation Fellow and a Master Teacher for The Lunt-Fontanne Ten Chimneys Fellowship Program.

Stephen's work appears in six Oscar nominated films, including Denis Villeneuve's, *DUNE*; Denzel Washington's, *Fences* (for which Stephen received a Virtuoso Award from the Santa Barbara International Film Festival); and Greta Gerwig's, *Lady Bird*. Noteworthy television work includes Halle Berry's directorial debut, BRUISED for Netflix and Alex Garland's FX/HULU series, DEVS.

PLAYWRIGHTS' SIDEWALK INDUCTEE



NTOZAKE SHANGE

Ntozake Shange, author of 36 published works, is increasingly recognized as one of America's greatest writers having, for 50 years, embodied the struggle of women of color for equality and the recognition of their contribution to human culture.

Her "choreo-poem," for colored girls who have considered suicide/ when the rainbow Is enuf, earned her an Obie Award for its sold-out 1976 Off-Broadway run and received a nomination as Best Play for its triumphal, 2 ½ year run on Broadway. That production retains its title as the longest-running play by an African American writer in Broadway history. A revival of for colored girls... opened in the 2022 Broadway season to unanimous critical acclaim and seven Tony® Award nominations. The play has remained in print since 1974.

Shange won a veritable mountain of awards throughout her career, including a second Obie in 1981 for her adaptation of *Bertolt Brecht's Mother Courage and Her Children* at the Public Theater, an Outer Critics Circle Award, an AUDELCO award, a Guggenheim fellowship, a National Endowment for the Arts fellowship, the Lila Wallace-Reader's Digest Fund Annual Writer's Award, the Los Angeles Times Book Prize for Poetry, the Paul Robeson Achievement Award, the National Black Theatre Festival's Living Legend Award, a New Federal Theatre Lifetime Achievement Award, and the Medal of Excellence from Columbia University. She was nominated, in addition to the Tony, for Grammy and Emmy awards.

Ntozake's literary legacy, preserved in the Shange Institute at Barnard College, comprises 13 plays, seven novels, six children's books and 19 poetry collections, the majority of which are published and in print. She is posthumously inducted into both the NY State Writer's Association and the Off-Broadway Alliance Halls of Fame. Her poetry collection "Wild Beauties" was received enthusiastically in 2018. A semi-autobiographical work entitled "Dance We Do" was released in 2020 from Beacon Press.

2022 has also seen the collaborative establishment, by Barnard College, the NY Shakespeare Festival/Public Theater and the Ntozake Shange Revocable Trust, of the Ntozake Shange Social Justice Playwright Residency and Shange's induction into the prestigious American Theater Hall of Fame where her legacy endres as one of the most cherished Black feminist writers of or time.

BODY OF WORK



A.R.T./NEW YORK

From its founding nearly 50 years ago in 1972 by a small collective to promote community and collaboration across a budding field, A.R.T./New York has become an essential pillar of a diverse member community of 475+ theatres and 150 individual producer and artist members. At its core, A.R.T./New York is the single membership organization serving the full breadth of New York City and state's not- for-profit theatre community.

A.R.T./NY serves the theatre ecosystem by providing theatremakers with the essential resources they need to put creative ideas on stage: space, education, funding and community. We operate subsidized office, rehearsal and theatre spaces out of three locations in NYC: South Oxford Space in Fort Greene Brooklyn, 520 Eighth Avenue, and the A.R.T./NY Theatres on 53rd and 10th Avenue. Trainings, educational programs, and access to free consultancies support the professional workforce addressing topics ranging from specialized sexual harassment trainings to financial planning to removing hiring bias and beyond. Our digital Educational Programming has asynchronous content available on-demand. Our Digital Resource HUB features a breadth of up-to-date resources available year-round on our website. A.R.T./NY also operates several grantmaking programs to direct financial resources throughout the field. The unifying service at A.R.T./NY is community building - whether that is through advocacy, member convenings, or responsive programming.

Our membership hails from all 5 boroughs and beyond and mirrors the diverse identities and visions that makes NYC's creative universe unparalleled. BIPOC-led theatres, and/or groups whose missions serve systematically marginalized communities, now represent the fastest growing demographic in our member base. This increase in BIPOC-led and neuro-diverse companies is a direct result of A.R.T./New York's work to create a more vibrant, activated, and welcoming space for all members by: 1) reducing financial, administrative, and access barriers to membership, workshops, and grant programs; 2) developing staff through internal anti-racism training and on-going staff-led accountability initiatives; and 3) centering new and underrepresented BIPOC consultants for A.R.T./New York workshops, member training and consultancies. As the A.R.T./New York Universe continues to expand, it is this determination to welcome and support every artist and organization that drives us forward. In the last year A.R.T./New York has seen a 20% increase in membership due largely to our restructuring of our membership tiers. The change to the ART/NY membership model was driven by the desire to remove barriers to entry. By shifting to a membership model consisting of "individuals" and "organizations," we eliminated the confusion in the pathway to membership.

Over the past three years, A.R.T./NY has reorganized its internal operations and expanded capacity in order to lead in alignment with our organizational values while providing leadership and support to our field. In addition to a significant shift in culture, this adjustment has led to A.R.T./NY adding 7 full time staff roles. Most recently, we welcomed Talia Corren to join Risa Shoup as Co-Executive Director, bringing our full time staff to a total of 18. Under Shoup and Corren, A.R.T./NY is committing to its next 50 years of service, stewardship, and leadership on behalf of the New York theatrical ecosystem.

A.R.T./New York celebrates 50 years of service to the field and our dedication to co-creating a thriving and equitable theatre ecosystem with you. We will be marking this milestone at our 50th Anniversary House Party on June 21.

SAMUEL BECKETT (1906-1989) was an Irish playwright, writer, poet, and director born in Dublin on Good Friday, April 13, 1906. He lived in Paris for much of his life and wrote in both English and French. Beckett penned plays, novels, short stories, poems, and French English translations. His best-known plays include *Waiting for Godot* and *Endgame*. Beckett received the Croix deGuerre and the Médaille de la Résistance for his participation in the French Resistance during World War II. His writing earned him a number of awards, including the 1969 Nobel Prize for Literature.

A Man of No Importance

TERRENCE MCNALLY was an American playwright, librettist, and LGBTQ+ trailblazer, described by the *New York Times* as "the bard of the American Theater." One of the few playwrights of his generation to successfully pass from the avant-garde to mainstream acclaim, Terrence redefined American playwriting for six decades and was the recipient of five Tony® Awards for *Love! Valour! Compassion!*, *Master Class, Kiss of the Spider Woman, Ragtime*, and for Lifetime Achievement. Terrence was also the

recipient of an Emmy Award (*Andre's Mother*), four Drama Desks, two Lortels, two Obies, the Dramatists Guild Lifetime Achievement Award, the Lucille Lortel Lifetime Achievement Award, and inductions into the American Theater Hall of Fame in 1996 and the American Academy of Arts and Letters in 2018.



STEPHEN FLAHERTY composed the scores for the musicals *Ragtime, Once On This Island, Anastasia, Seussical, Rocky, A Man Of No Importance, The Glorious Ones, Dessa Rose, My Favorite Year, Lucky Stiff, Little Dancer and Knoxville.* He's won Tony®, Olivier, Drama Desk and Outer Critics Circle awards, plus multiple Oscar, Golden Globe and Grammy nominations. He and longtime collaborator Lynn Ahrens were inducted into the Theater Hall of Fame

in 2015. With Ms. Ahrens, he co-founded the DGF Fellows Program for emerging writers and serves on Council at the Dramatists Guild. www.AhrensAndFlaherty.com

STEPHEN SONDHEIM wrote music and lyrics for *Saturday Night, A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, Anyone Can Whistle, Company, Follies, A Little Night Music, The Frogs, Pacific Overtures, Sweeney Todd, Merrily We Roll Along, Sunday in the Park with George, Assassins, Passion and Road Show and lyrics for West Side Story, Gypsy and Do I Hear a Waltz?* His collected lyrics with attendant essays have been published in two

volumes: *Finishing the Hat* and *Look, I Made a Hat*. In 2010, the Broadway theatre formerly known as Henry Miller's Theatre was renamed in his honor.



GEORGE FURTH graduated from Northwestern University's School of Speech and received a Master's in fine arts from Columbia. After writing the book for the Tony® Award-winning *Company*, he collaborated again with Stephen Sondheim, writing the book for *Merrily We Roll Along*. He went on to write the play or book for *Twigs*, *The Act*, *The Supporting Cast*, *Precious Sons* and *Getting Away With Murder* (with Stephen Sondheim). He won the Drama Desk, Outer Critics Circle,

London's Olivier, Evening Standard Award, Chicago's Jefferson, the Andy and Drama League awards. He was a member of the Actors Studio and the Dramatists Guild.

In 1959, she became the youngest American playwright and the only African American to win the New York Drama Critics Circle Award for Best Play for *A Raisin in the Sun*. In 1965, she died of cancer. *To Be Young, Gifted, and Black*, an autobiographical portrait adapted by her former husband and literary executor Robert Nemiroff, was produced in 1969. Hansberry's writings

also include *The Sign in Sidney Brustein's Window, Les Blancs, The Drinking Gourd, What Use Are Flowers?*, and *The Movement*. The Lorraine Hansberry Papers are located at the Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture in New York City. www.lhlt.org
